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The Jefferson County Landmarks Commission met at 10:00 a.m., Monday, May 20th in the Jefferson County Planning Commission's Office. Those present were Miss Emily Stanley, Mrs. Leeds K. Riely, Dr. John Washington, Capt. John Schley and Mr. Archie Franzen.

Dr. Washington reported that the four drawer file cabinet has been ordered and should arrive in approximately three weeks and would cost in the neighborhood of \$165.00.

Mrs. Riely reported her purchase of miscellaneous office supplies amounting to \$41.80.

It was suggested that the Commission apply to the County Court for money to purchase stamps from the Post Office. A receipt is required from the Post Office for presentation to the Court. It was felt that \$50.00 worth of stamps should be initially purchased. Dr. Washington is to endorse check for stamps and have receipt signed at Post Office.

Capt. Schley reported on prices quoted by two foundry firms for casting bronze plaques for affixing to structures selected for landmark status.

Mrs. Riely will purchase a number of three-cut legal size folders and a stapler.
