

The Jefferson County Landmarks Commission met on Monday, February 24th in the Jefferson County Planning Commission's Office at 10:00 a.m. Those present were Miss Emily Stanley, Mrs. Leeds K. Riely, Dr. John Washington, Capt. John Schley and Mr. Archie Franzen.

Capt. Schley reported that the owners of Piedmont and Springwood had not as yet responded to the Commission's request to place their homes on the Landmark Commission's Register.

Miss Stanley reported on an additional allocation by the County Court of \$1,200.00 for the purchase of additional plaques.

Dr. Washington read the texts for road-sign vignettes for the following properties.

Members discussed each submission and agreed that most of the texts should be made in briefer form. Dr. Washington requested that each person preparing a text also fill out a state standard form of the property descriptive.

It was agreed by all that the Commission purchase 1,000 sheets of reproduction paper for the Planning Commission in return for obtaining copies of documents run on the Planning Commission's duplicator.

A short discussion on a road marker for Piedmont took place and the probability of construction dates from several sources was weighed. The kitchen portion of the structure was the only part deemed to date prior to the revolutionary period.
