The Jefferson County Landmarks Commission met in the County Planning Commission's Office on Monday, April 7th at 10:00 a.m. Present were Miss Stanley, Mrs. Riely, Capt. Schley and Mr. Franzen. Dr. Washington, Chairman, was absent and Capt. Schley chaired the meeting.

Capt. Schley reported that the County Court has approved \$1200.00 for the working budget for fiscal year 1976 for the Landmarks Commission.

Mrs. Riely suggested Mr. Charles Wood as a possible candidate for a typist position. Mrs. Riely will contact Mr. Wood in the near future. Various methods of paying for such services were discussed.

Capt. Schley reported on the status of the Commission's Register of Historic places. Forms for Travelers Rest and White House have been completed and forms for other structures visited are in various stages of filling out.

Mrs. Riely reported on the interior decorating committee's recommendations for redoing the Court House. They are seeking the assistance of Mr. Elliott W. Jayne, Director of Security for Colonial Williamsburg for recommendations concerning floor finishes and coverings.

Mrs. Riely read a letter addressed to Dr. Leonard Davis, West Virginia Antiquities Commission requesting aid in having the Charles Town Opera House listed on the National Register.

The Commission discussed additional Bi-Centennial period houses that may be eligible for Landmark status. They were

Israel Friend
Eastwood
Rehaud House

Capt. Schley mentioned that the treasurer's records are required to be audited by two members of the Commission as stated in the by-laws. Mrs. Riely and Miss Stanley examined the treasurer's report and found it in good order.

Capt. Schley listed Piedmont, Springdale and Springwood as the next recipients of bronze plaques.
