<p>This is a 4-bay Flemish bond brick farmhouse with an intersecting gable roof. The location of the chimneys suggests that it was erected in several stages. The facade incorporated a laterally-oriented gable roof with interior gable-end brick chimneys and a hipped-roofed porch supported by Doric columns. Fenestration is flat-topped, with multi-light sash and some windows with exterior operable louvered wood shutters. <p>An agricultural complex is located southwest of the house, including a substantial gambrel-roofed wood dairy barn with side lean-to wings and several other wood sheds and dependencies of indeterminate age and usage.</p> <p style="text-align: right;"><i>(Use Continuation Sheets)</i></p>	
Statement of Significance	
<p>Built on one of the Lord Fairfax patents, the original section of this property was completed in 1795 by a member of the Briscoe family who retained ownership until 1807 when it was sold to the Camerons who in 1816 built the front section (dated in the basement). The nearby settlement of Aldrich was originally known as Cameron's Depot and was renamed when the Camerons sold the farm to the Aldriches, who gave the farm its name. The property appears to meet National Register Criterion C for <i>architecture</i>, as an early Jefferson County Flemish bond brick farmhouse; an inspection of the interior would be required to confirm this determination.</p> <p style="text-align: right;"><i>(Use Continuation Sheets)</i></p>
