This property is located in rural Jefferson County, south of the county seat of Charles Town. Two stone piers flank the entrance to the driveway

This is an imposing Greek Revival-style brick residence with a three-bay facade and a hipped roof penetrated by two large brick chimneys. The main entrance is centered on the facade, indicating a central-passage interior plan, and is shielded by a one story portico supported by paired wood posts. Centered on the facade on the second story is a three-part widow unit with a conventional center sash flanked by smaller side lights, a design feature seen elsewhere in Jefferson County. All fenestration is flat-topped, with exterior operable louvered shutters. Extending across the rear elevation is a one-story Colonial Revival-style porch with an upper balustrade accessed by second-floor doors which may have been modified from windows. Interior elements include a spiral stair leading to the attic.

Statement of Significance

"Springland" was erected by Samuel Lackland and was in the hands of his descendants until the 1960s. The house is marked with a plaque stating "JEFFERSON COUNTY HISTORIC LANDMARK." This property appears to meet National Register Criterion C for architecture, although an inspection of the interior would be required to confirm this determination.
