This is a modestly-detailed Romanesque Revival-style rural church finished in stucco with a gable roof and a gable-end orientation, with a fo-ward projecting bay on the facade which incorporates a centered main entrance accessed by a series of straight run stairs. This front bay terminates in a two stage tower with a bell tower and a pyramidal roof capped with a finial. Fenestration is round-arched, glazed with art glass, and the main entrance of the facade is capped with a semi-circular transom. Small brackets are under the eaves. The building incorporates a raised foundation with segmental-arched windows penetrating the basement.
